INTRODUCTION

THE COURSE

Our Green keeping staff have had their work cut out this season with the amazing summer that we have had. The dry summer meant that the course got bare and a lot of time needed to be spent watering the greens to keep them in good shape. I don't think that anyone could argue that we have some of the best greens in this area. The Rabbit population was probably at its highest level in years this year and the dry conditions made it almost impossible to sort out the damage that they caused. We have also got a more reliable group of people dealing with the pest control aspect and this is ongoing. As I have stated before, in our newsletter, we are not alone when it comes to the Rabbits. I have had various conversations with officials at other clubs this season who have had similar issues. We have a terrific golf course, and this is recognised nationally with us featuring in the Top 100 Scottish courses in Today's Golfer Magazine's Travel 2019 Guide where we were one of only 9 North East Clubs that featured in this publication. We have also been recognised by another national magazine. (more on this later in the report)

MEMBERSHIP

Our golfing membership numbers this year have stayed the same as last season. There have been movements or changes among the categories. However, the actual number of golfers has remained the same. This is a real positive for the Club as a lot of clubs are on the slide membership wise for various reasons. I am hopeful that with the New AWPR on the verge of fully opening we will be able to attract people from further afield to join our Club. We already know that it takes 15 minutes to get here from Bridge of Don and about 20 minutes from Dyce. We will get more information on the time taken from other points when the road opens fully.

I will be organising a New season membership drive very soon where we can target some areas where potential members may stay. What form this takes has yet to be decided but a Flyer drop could be an option as this type of thing has worked in the past.

We need to do more for the Junior membership of the Club. I am hoping that with the help of some parents, or willing and able volunteers, that we can organise some small competitions for the Juniors this coming season. Andrew Cooper has held Junior coaching sessions in his time at the Club. However, Andrew is now moving away, and the onus must come back to the Club to encourage youth development in the game. There will be rules and regulations that need addressed initially before we could do anything, but it would be good to involve the local school as there could be budding golfers right under our noses.

Next season the Gents version will be played in conjunction with the six Saturday competitions after the Dunn Challenge 2^{nd} round.
