When playing a stableford competition pick up if you are unlikely to score any points on a hole, this will also help with the pace of play.



Our new green keeping shed is taking shape nicely with he shed itself currently being erected. The next stage will be to ensure that the inside is kitted out with everything that is required. A new shed has been on the agenda for a number of years now and it is very pleasing to see that we are finally at the stage we are at now. We had hoped it would be up an operational by now, however between materials not being available and the weather of late we are not quite over the line, but the first stage of the project should be complete in a couple of weeks' time.

At last, the new Greenkeeping Shed is almost erect and it won't be long till the guys can enjoy somewhere, dry, safe, and secure to store the new machinery we have invested in to help them bring the course along. It's been a long time coming to fruition, but this will provide a place for the machinery for many years to come, reducing exposure to the elements, decreasing repairs, and increasing the longevity of the kit.

However, I am sure the hardier souls amongst us will be out there every week come rain, shine or snow enjoying the fresh air. Can I remind everyone to repair their own pitch mark plus another please? It made the final holes all the more interesting, but Craig held on to become the champion for 2021. Derek picked up the handicap championship trophy. Both players will now go on to represent the club in the EE champion of Champions event in 2022



The Gents season, again, had a disrupted start with a few of the early season competitions not being played for. We eventually got started with the first event of the Season being the May Spring Open, on May  $1^{st}$ .

We did manage to see winners of all the trophy events from May onwards with one to note, being the first ever winner of the Donald Webster Stableford League (David Burness). Covid had postponed this by 12 months, so it was finally good to have out first winner of the new competition. Congratulations go to all the trophy winners from the section this year.

On the team, we re-joined the GDL Pennant League after a 2-year absence and it was tough going with a strong opposition in the section. Newburgh finished  $4^{th}$  in the 6-team league.

In the Greensomes League, however, the Newburgh boys reached the semi-final, losing out to Craibstone at this hurdle. We finished 2<sup>nd</sup> in the league behind Inverurie before making the trip to Craibstone.

This year saw the teams sponsored by E&M Electrical, Mile End Motors and 2 Circles who will continue their support next season as part of the 2-year deal.

Next season's fixtures are being put together over the coming weeks with the club championship likely to return to a more traditional time of year, in June. Again, we will send out a digital version of this, as was done last year.

In the 2021 Champion of Champions (the first time Ladies' have been included!) Karen Shaw and Maureen McFarland both played in the Scratch section. Karen lost narrowly (2&1) in Rd 1 to Lynne Terry of Cruden Bay, with Maureen winning her Rd 1 tie but then going on to lose 3&2 to eventual winner Julie Henderson of Inverurie.

On the Team golf front, disappointingly the ALCGA (Aberdeenshire County) League was cancelled this year, so our Ladies didn't have the chance to show Division 1 "what we're all about" but hope to put that right in 2022 with resumption of the League. We did however, put on

a good show in the Robertson Cup with a resounding 1st round win (11.5-4.5) over Ellon. Our next match against Peterhead came down to the wire, finally losing 9-7 on what was the hottest day we've ever known at Newburgh. Special thanks go to AMPLA (sponsors of our Team tops).

One event worthy of special mention is the Loving Cup (NOYGC Annual Ladies v Gents match) where the Ladies retained the trophy for the 3rd year in a row - come on Gents, you need to have a serious team talk and get your game together for the 2022 fixture!!

Our Ladies Open unfortunately had to be cancelled this year due to horrendous rain which saw the course closed for the day. Fingers crossed 2022 is kinder to us when we hope to host both a Ladies Individual Open and a Ladies Tri-Am. Again, we can't thank Lady Helen Wood enough for her continued support and sponsorship of our Open.

With the season now drawing to a close, we'd like to congratulate all our 2021 Trophy winners and look forward to starting all over again on 2022. It looks like a bit of an obstacle course but needs must to get these areas to recover. We are now back into regular greens maintenance with shallow spiking and topdressing through the winter
